Lateness

Please can you keep making an effort to ensure your child is in school on time? We have noticed that particularly at Merrywood, there has been an increase in persistent lateness, with up to 15 children every day arriving after the gates are closed.

Late marks are looked at as part of our monitoring of attendance and so it is really important that children are here in time to lead into school with their class at 8.45 (Merrywood) and 8.55 (Myrtle) at the latest.

Remember to wear any combination of red, orange, purple or black, plain without patterns. The performance begins at 4pm at Ashton Park secondary school, however the children will need to dropped off at 2:45pm to practice beforehand.

Uniform Policy

Last Summer we published an updated uniform policy which contained a few changes. At the time, we were mindful that some parents and carers would have already bought items so we phased the policy in, with it coming into full effect from September 2024.

Thank you for the steps you have already taken to follow this policy in full. This is just a reminder that when you are buying uniform items for next year, the following applies:

Classroom Wear

- Red school sweatshirts, cardigans, hoodies or zipped long sleeved top (plain or with school badge)
- White or red polo shirts (plain or with school badge)
- Dark grey or black shorts, trousers, skirts, skorts or pinafore dresses
- Plain grey, black or red tights
- Plain white, grey or black socks
- Black flat shoes or plain black trainers (with no additional colours or markings)
- Closed toe sandals (with a fastening around the heel)

• Red gingham dresses, shorts or playsuits

Available from Monkhouse (Bedminster branch):

- Sweatshirts, hoodies, cardigans and polo shirts with school badge on front
- Book bags

Where hairbands are worn, they should be plain red, white or black and no wider than 5cms. Flowers, bows or other accessories are not permitted. Hairclips should be plain. Scarves or other head coverings are allowed for religious/cultural reasons only.

<u>PE Kit</u>

- Plain black daps, plimsolls or trainers (an age-appropriate fastening helps to ensure children are as independent as possible)
- Black shorts and white or red polo shirt or t-shirt*
- Black tracksuit/jogging trousers or leggings and a warm black, grey or red top for outdoor PE in the winter

Please note that coloured t-shirts other than red or white will no longer be allowed for PE.

<u>PE Days</u>

On days when a child has PE, they will still be allowed to wear their PE kit to school for the day rather than getting changed specifically for the lesson. This is to maximise curriculum time and reduce lost property.

One of the reasons we have introduced the option of plain black trainers as an alternative to school shoes is so that they can be worn five days a week and therefore reduce the expense associated with having one pair of shoes for PE days and another for other days.

This means that a child could wear the same top(s) and plain black trainers every day of the week, with the only difference on PE days being what they are wearing on their lower half.
