## **Meal Prices from September**

As you are aware, costs in all areas have been increasing in recent years and it has become more and more difficult to source quality ingredients for school meals whilst continuing to make the service viable.

In order to maintain the quality and portion size we currently offer; from September the cost of a preschool meal will be £2.45 and for a Key Stage 2 pupil it will be £2.90. We are anticipating that Key Stage 1 meals will continue to be fully funded.

#### **Southville Chess Masters**

A couple of weeks ago, 9 of our Year 6 pupils qualified to participate in the UK Chess Challenge 2024 Bristol Megafinal at Bristol Grammar School.

Forty schools were represented, with 150 chess players competing. Southville Primary sent nine pupils, the largest number of representatives from one school in the U12 category.

The competition involved playing six games throughout the day, with scores of 0 for a loss, 0.5 for a draw, and 1 point for a win. Players scoring at least 3.5 points out of 6 rounds would qualify for the Gigafinals.

This was the children's first experience of competitive chess outside of school, and they were amazing. They exhibited great concentration, strategy, and resilience, even when they lost a game and felt upset. Each child, along with their parents, experienced a roller coaster of emotions—from the exhilaration of winning to the disappointment of losing. So, how did they do? It might sound like a cliché, but they're all winners, regardless of whether they advance to the next stage or not. They put their very best efforts into the day. Four of the boys scored enough points to qualify for the Gigafinal. However, after such a tense experience, some are still deliberating whether they want to take up that challenge!



Thank you to the parents who supported this event (and to Cam for the lovely report above!) and well done to our fantastic chess players for taking this challenge on and representing the school so brilliantly. We are really proud of the growing chess culture we have at Southville and will be continuing to provide the chess workshops for all children in years 2 and 6 as part of our curriculum next year.
